Resources for Discussion and Reflection

As we plan for more formal ways to help you keep dialogue about the Bible alive in your communities, here are some resources to keep you going right now.

1. On the back of this sheet is a Bible study exercise for a small group.
2. At massbible.org/experiment you can find video of all the questions asked at both Yale and Albany broken out by question so that you can listen to the panelists' responses to the question and still have time to get responses from your own group. Do you agree with what we said? Do you think we missed the mark? Watch and talk about it.
3. In addition to those things, there are reflection/discussion questions below to help you think more about your own relationship to the Bible and its role in faith and culture.

1. What word comes to mind when YOU think about the Bible? Why?
2. Did you grow up with any exposure to the Bible? If so, what was that exposure like? What impressions of the Bible did it leave you with?
3. Take a Bible and open it up to any page and read a random verse. Do you think that verse is equally as important as all the other verses in the Bible? Do and ask that five more times. Should we give equal weight and attention to all verses of the Bible?
4. What is your own biggest obstacle when it comes to reading and understanding the Bible?
